Fiduciary Money Art

This talk explores the artistic and symbolic design of money—where graphic design, political messaging, and material culture intersect. Known as fiduciary art, this visual language shapes how we perceive and trust money, reinforcing its authority and value.

Marina Fischer is a Curator of Numismatics at Nickle Galleries, Libraries and Cultural Resources at the University of Calgary. She holds an M.A. in Ancient History with specialization in Art History from the University of Calgary. She oversees the university's vast money collection of 23,000 objects spanning from the beginning of coinage in the 7th century BCE to the modern period. She is a recipient of a University of Calgary Teaching Award, and lectures frequently in various departments across campus and beyond.
